Kindergarten Fact Sheet

AGE	An incoming Kindergarten student must be 5 by October 1, 2017.
MEDICAL FORM	This form will be mailed to incoming K students in April and must be returned to St. Dominic School by August 1, 2017.
NON-REFUNDABLE REGISTRATION FEE	A non-refundable registration fee of \$100.00 for full day or \$50.00 for half day must accompany registration along with a copy of the child's birth & baptismal certificates (if baptized) and parents driver's license. One of the following documents proving residency is also required: a current mortgage statement, rental agreement, current property tax statement, a deed, a current utility bill or current homeowner/renter insurance statement.

UNIFORM REQUIREMENTS	<p>Uniforms are required for Kindergarten.</p> <p>Girls: Regulation plaid jumper (grades K-5) or plaid skirt (grades 5-8) and a white blouse, white or black polo (no logos) or ribbed bottom shirt. Black, tan, or navy uniform line slacks.</p> <p>Boys: Black, tan, or navy uniform line slacks. White dress shirt with a collar, white or black polo (no logos) or ribbed bottom shirt.</p> <p>Shorts in the same colors as slacks may be worn from April 1st through October 31st.</p> <p>The Student Handbook contains further dress code/uniform information.</p> <p>Uniforms are available at Schoolbelles, 5718 Harrison Ave. 45248, (513) 921-3417</p>
TRANSPORTATION	Buses are available to Oak Hills District students outside a 2 mile radius and Cincinnati Public District students outside a 1 mile radius of St. Dominic School. Busing is determined by each school district based on the practicality of routing. Qualified half day Kindergarten students are transported to school only; midday transportation home is not available.
SCHOOL DAY	Half Day: 8:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. Full Day: 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.
STAFF/CLASS SIZE	Certified Kindergarten teachers and aides. Each class is targeted at 20 students.
CHILD CARE	The Before School Program opens at 6:30 a.m. and is available to all Kindergarten students. The After School Program runs until 6:00 p.m. and is only available to Kindergarten students in the full day class. Both programs run on-site at St. Dominic School for an additional fee. RELIGION	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Increase awareness of self and the world as creations of God • Develop a capacity for spontaneous prayer • Know God as a loving parent and Jesus as our brother • Experience celebration and worship as a Christian community • Encourage love of God and neighbor
LEARNING BEHAVIORS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Listen attentively and follow directions • Use materials and time responsibly • Work and play well with others; demonstrate self-control
LANGUAGE/ LITERACY	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Encourage love of reading • Build comprehension skills • Contribute to group discussions • Organize ideas to communicate effectively • Respond to stories with pictures and writing • Use developmental spelling to communicate in print • Print first and last name • Recognize and print upper and lower case letters • Associate sounds with letters; blend sounds; beginning and ending sounds • Know basic sight words; recognize rhyming words
MATHEMATICS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Recognize basic shapes • Recognize, sequence, and write numbers 1-20 • Match sets of objects with numbers • Classify by color, shape, and size • Use manipulatives to explore addition and subtraction • Measure in informal units and compare weights, heights, and lengths • Recognize and know value of a penny, nickel, and dime • Explore time concepts (days of the week, months of the year) • Understand concepts of more, fewer, same number • Copy, extend, and create patterns
THEME STUDIES (Science/Social Studies)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Discuss the weather and seasons • Awareness of senses • Describe some ways in which animals adapt to seasonal changes • Become aware of different types of families; interaction of members • Develop environmental awareness • Develop a respect for and understanding of rules • Discuss topics of health and safety
ART	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Handle scissors and glue properly; color neatly • Experience many types of medium; use materials creatively • Follow directions
SPECIAL CLASSES	Music, Physical Education, Library, and Computer classes once a week.
